Sub-Committees and their Activities

- 5. For the student seeking for admission to B.A. (HONS) in Bengali, English, Sanskrit, History, Political Science, Philosophy, Education percentage of marks for best of five subjects in H.S./ Equivalent examination must be at least 45% / for HONS subject (to be sought) that to be at least 50%.
- 6. For the student seeking for admission to B.Sc. (HONS) in Physics percentage of marks for best of five subjects in H.S./ Equivalent examination must be at least 45% and Physics subject that to be at least 50% along with pass marks in Mathematics.
- 7. For the student seeking for admission to B.Sc. (HONS) in Chemistry and Mathematics percentage of marks for best of five subjects in H.S./ Equivalent examination must be at least 45% /for HONS subject (to be sought) that to be at least 50%.
- 8. For the student seeking for admission to B.Sc. (HONS) in **Zoology** and **Botany** percentage of marks for best of five subjects in **H.S./ Equivalent examination must** be at least 45% /for HONS subject (to be sought) that to be at least 50% along with pass marks in Chemistry.
- 9. For the student seeking for admission to B.Sc. (HONS) in Economics percentage of marks for best of five subjects in H.S./ Equivalent examination must be at least 45% and Economics subject that to be at least 50%
- 10. For the student seeking for admission to B.A. (HONS) in Library and Information Studies percentage of marks for best of five subjects in **H.S.** / **Equivalent examination** must be at least 45%.

- 11. For the student seeking for admission to B.Sc. (HONS) in Geography percentage of marks for best of five subjects in H.S./ Equivalent examination must be at least 45% and Geography subject that to be at least 50%.
- 12. For the student seeking for admission to B.Com. (HONS) percentage of marks for best of five subjects in H.S./ Equivalent examination must be at least 45% /Accountancy subject that to be at least 50%.
- 13. Students of **Vocational Stream** are allowed to apply only for B.A./B.Sc. (General) courses.

Facilities within the campus

Central Library:

College Library of Sabang Sajanikanta Mahavidyalaya started its journey in a small room of the Institute old Building (Vidyasagar Hall) in the year 1970, and moved to its present premises in 2012. Since then, it has grown in size and content to take the present shape. For few years, the library has become the lifeline of the academic activities of the Institute. It has been catering to the needs of our students of undergraduates, postgraduates, faculty and staff members.

The library has a collection of more than 30,000 volumes which includes text Books, reference books & printed journals, etc. It has also special collection of books on Swami Vivekananda and Swami Swarupananda. With the development of Information and Communication Technology (ICT), the behavioural characteristics of the library users have been changing rapidly and the library is trying its best to adapt with the technological advancement.

The College Library has developed computer based information storage and retrieval system in the multi-user environment using KOHA software; an Open Source Library Management Software package. The identity of all books and the library users are fully barcoded and all Library house-keeping operations like, acquisition, cataloguing and circulation services have been automated with the help of KOHA software package

The book database is accessible through OPAC (Online Public Access Catalogue). Now it is a partially automated modern library is on its way to becoming an outstanding learning

resource centre catering to the ever growing and uncompromising information and intellectual requirements of the students, faculty members of the Institute. To ensure proper surveillance, electronic surveillance system has been adopted in some important service areas within the library.

The library also has a well-equipped Xerox centre and the users can avail this facility on payment of a nominal charge.

Computer Lab

There is a well-equipped and well decorated computer laboratory with internet facilities. Department of Mathematics, Commerce, Economics, Physics and Chemistry use it as a departmental laboratory by sharing as well as all students can use it as required.

Vidyasagar Auditorium Hall

Vidyasagar Auditorium Hall of the Sabang Sajanikanta Mahavidyalaya is a moderate hall built to enable an audience of 200 seating capacity with a concrete in-built stage.

Games and Sports

There is sufficient arrangement for outdoor games such Foot Ball, Cricket, Volley Ball, Basket Ball, Hand Ball, Badminton etc. in the college. The students of the college win some prize from University level competition.

Common Room

There are two separate common rooms, one for male students and other for female students. Students are provided newspapers, magazines, different indoor game facilities like carom, table tennis etc.

Vidyasagar Path Parishad

With a view to fostering a sense of culture in the locality, Vidyasagar Path Parishad being established in the year 1970, 150 Birth Anniversary of Pandit Iswar Chandra Vidyasagar,

organises several competitions every year among its members from neighbouring educational and cultural institutions including mother institution. The Parishad organises meeting, seminar, yoga camp, career counselling programme etc. which are addressed by the eminent guest.

Departmental Library

Departmental library is available in each department. Some departments also have open book corners. Students of the concerned department can use these libraries easily.

Hostels

There are two hostels - one for male students and one for female students under control of the college hostel committee. Two hostel superintendents appointed by the college administration to supervise the hostels and maintain the books of accounts.

- a. Swarupananda Boy's Hostel
- b. Nivedita Girls Hostel
- Admission to hostel: The students seeking admission to hostel for a particular session
 are required to apply in the prescribed form to the superintendent. The seats allotted to
 the students are notified and the students are required to pay the fees and charges at the
 time of admission.
- Charges: Establishment charge including electric, seat rent, cook etc. should be deposited by the student at the time of admission. Messing charge should be deposited by the student in every month as required.

• Discipline:

- 1. Attendance compulsory for both the morning and evening prayer.
- 2. Strict discipline is to be maintained during the study hours.
- 3. Students must observe the study hours prescribed by the authority.
- 4. Use of common room is strictly prohibited during the study hours.
- 5. Lunch and dinner time is strictly maintained by the students as per the prescribed schedule of the authorities.

- 6. The boarders of the room concerned are to purchase the bulb, etc. at their own expenses. The authority will make arrangement to their effect only the very beginning of the new session for once.
- 7. No guest will allow to stay overnight in the hostel.
- 8. No boarders are allowed to stay during the vacations like summer, Puja, Christmas etc.

Gymnasium:

The institute has its own gymnasium for the students. The gym is consisted of multigym system as well as other equipments.

CCTV Surveillance

Closed-circuit television (CCTV), also known as video surveillance (VS), is the use of video cameras to transmit a signal to a specific place, on a limited set of monitors. In recent years CCTV is widely used in different institutions due to its success in preventing bullying, vandalism, monitoring visitors and maintaining a record of evidence in the event of a crime. There are some restrictions on installation, with cameras not being installed in an area where there is a "reasonable expectation of privacy". in our institution it was installed over the years. However, recently we are increasing its view points of surveillance through most recent technology of communication media i.e.Fiber Optics. More than hundreds of CCTV cameras were installed throughout the lawn and main transit areas of the premises. All the camera monitors and transfer high rate of data to the nVRs& DVRs all the time (24×7) without any intervention.

Mentor-mentee System:

Mentor-mentee program has been started in the Mahavidyalaya wherein the teaching faculties of this Mahavidyalaya are doing the job as the mentors and the students are considered as the mentee.

Objectives:

i. To help the students for understanding the challenges and opportunities present in the college and develop a smooth transition to campus life.

- ii. To counsel academically weak students and to play an important role in helping troubled students to cope with academic, extra-academic and personal problems.
- iii. To proactively try to identify problems of the general student populace and to bring them to the notice of the concerned authorities. The practice of Mentor-Mentee program endeavours to pursue these objectives by guiding the students by the teaching faculty who can act as a friend, philosopher and guide to them. Mentors of each department, selected by the teachers of the concerned department, play this role and are given the authority to pursue the mission of this programme. Each of them is assigned a group of students however, their role is limited to counseling and motivating them to better direction. As the Mahavidyalaya suffers from huge shortage of teaching faculty, the programme is in fledgling stage. Only programs like counseling,

Internal Evaluation (CIE) system

The Mahavidyalaya has very little scope to bring reforms in the CIE. However, the institution does undertake internal assessment (class test of 10 marks) of 2 tests for the honours courses and 1 test for General Degree courses for each semester. Internal assessments are arranged on surprise test basis. Questions are set based on the topics covered in the previous classes. After the class tests are over the questions are uploaded in the Mahavidyalaya's website. Students who fail to appear on the days of class tests are offered a second chance, provided a valid ground of absence is produced before the head of the department through written application. Results of the internal assessment are published in the departmental notice board. Students are given an opportunity to interact with the teacher in their next class to understand/correct the weak points both in terms of data and style of writing, of their answer scripts. After the completion of all the tests an average marks obtained are calculated by the respective departments and sent to the Vidyasagar University (V.U.). Other than this mechanism of CIE the institution also keeps a record of the advanced and slow learners based on the responses in the classes and the marks scored in the class tests. A special attention is given to these groups of students through special classes and remedial classes. Both types of classes are taken in the 'tutorial' slot of the routine.

Career Counselling

The institution has a dedicated career counselling cell which has actively help students throughout the year to suggest the right pathway for choosing career in different fields after completing degree courses. - The Cultural competition of the Mahavidyalaya is organized by the Students 'Union every year. All the students are requested to take part in the competition an automatic screening is done through this competition for the students who will take part in the University's (VU) cultural competition.
- The union publishes their annual magazine every year. A team of magazine committee is selected every year whose primary duty is to collect the writings from the students and place

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them before the editors' board (comprising teachers) for final selection. The magazine offers

an excellent opportunity to the students to ventilate their unexplored brilliance present in them.

• The college has a history of showing good performance in Youth Parliament competition. It

performed well in District level Competition as well as State Level Competition. Credit goes

to the Union, right from developing the script to selection of students for the specific role, the

arrangement of rehearsals, purchasing drama attires and logistical support all are done by the

union.

• The annual sports of the college as a gala event, where all the departments take active

participation. A college football team is selected by the union with the help of the physical

education teacher, just after the annual sports. This football team (students mainly comprising

from hostel) undertake regular practice and perform praise worthy performance at the

University level as well as at State level competition.

• The union also take active participation in selecting NCC and NSS cadets. Regular activities

of the NCC and NSS like establishment of practice camp, visiting to adopted villages,

organizing seminars – film show – campus cleaning – environmental awareness in villages for

NSS volunteers etc. are carried out with the help of the union.

• Amongst other works the union also logistically helps the institution organizing

state/national/international seminars, invited lectures, teachers' day celebration, Independence

Day celebration etc.
